

Statement from Dominic Grossi, Candidate for Marin County Supervisor, on **Cycling**

Improving the safety of our bike paths and increasing the overall safety of all cyclists is very important to me. It is incumbent upon us to make sure all our residents, from kids to our workforce to recreational cyclists, can bike to school, to work or out in our community without fear of being struck by a motor vehicle, as today, in many places it cannot be done safely.

In an effort to enhance cycling opportunities in the 4th District, I support getting the Alto Tunnel path opened. I would also work with and support organizations that will help find federal and/or state money to get the tunnel opened, but we should be sensitive to the concerns of neighbors and try to address their concerns. I believe this is an opportunity to create a flat pathway for kids and adults to provide a safer path than the "Camino Alto" hill route or the "horsehill" route which runs parallel to the freeway. I also believe that this direct connection will help ease traffic burdens between Mill Valley and Corte Madera.

For full disclosure, not much has been said about the bike path along the SMART tracks. I will support this as long as we are cognizant of the neighbors where the path will be (i.e., making sure that fences are well kept to keep the ranches and their operations separated from the bike path for safety purposes).
