

Statement from Dominic Grossi, Candidate for Marin County Supervisor, on **the lawsuit affecting farmers and ranchers in the Point Reyes National Seashore**

As a 4th generation Marin County resident and 4th generation dairyman and rancher, Dominic is deeply concerned about the long-term vitality of farming and ranching in the Point Reyes National Seashore. Many of these farms and ranches have been in the same family for generations, and Dominic can personally relate to existing challenges facing the agricultural community.

20% of Marin County's agricultural economy is derived from agricultural operations on the National Parkland. The ongoing lawsuit not only threatens the livelihood of farmers and ranchers living within the parkland, but Marin County's agricultural economy as a whole.

Dominic is the only candidate for 4th District Supervisor that truly understands the needs facing the agricultural community. He knows that farmers and ranchers have been good stewards of the land, and believes that farming and the environment can co-exist in harmony. On the Board of Supervisors, Dominic will work to protect agriculture and keep agricultural lands in open space.
